A SETTEE IN THE EARLY GEORGIAN MANNER

H: 42 in / 107 cm | W: 60 in / 153 cm | D: 26 in / 66 cm

Constructed in red walnut, and reupholstered recently in a patterned damask; rising from cabriole legs with 'hairy paw' feet, with lion masks atop: the serpentine front and side rails carved with acanthus foliates; swept foliate carved arms terminate in eagle heads, conjoining the drop in seat with the shaped back.
