The tables of kidney-shape and veneered with fine mahogany, supported on cabriole legs with lion's paw sabots and ormolu espagnolettes joined together by a shaped undertier, the fluted legs extending to support the shaped top and frieze enclosing a lockable drawer with curved front; surmounted by a fleur de pêcher marble top and three-quarter pierced brass gallery.

This popular model was made by some of the best Parisian cabinetmakers of the [Belle Époque](#), including Paul Sormani and [François Linke](#). Linke is most often associated with the use of fleur de pêcher marble as seen on these occasional tables.
