

A PAIR OF OCCASIONAL TABLES IN THE LOUIS XV TRANSITIONAL TASTE

Constructed in tulipwood with <u>kingwood</u> employed in the cross banding and inlay work alongside boxwood stringing, and dressed with gilt bronze mounts; of rectangular form, with radiused corners, rising from sabot shod cabriole legs, supporting undertiers with arcaded pierced galleries, having bronze espagnolettes at the shoulders; the aprons of serpentine form, with elliptical 'font vert' <u>Sèvres style</u> plaques applied to fascias and rears, hand painted in polychromes with <u>bucolic scenes</u>, and enclosed within floral cast mounts; the hinged and lockable tops, with diamond form book matched central medallions, lift to reveal velvet lined interiors, and have stiff leaf cast guard bands.
