Constructed in [mahogany](#), having beautifully turned and reeded front legs and elegant sabre legs to the rear, the back rest of a most unusual waisted shape and adorned with carved garlands, ribbons, laurel wreaths and English roses. Each stamped "W. Huxley" to the underside.

William Latham Huxley (fl. 1822-1845) is a recorded cabinetmaker from Liverpool, having been apprenticed there to Thomas Croft Huxley of 52 Park Lane in 1822. A set of chairs, stamped by Huxley, are today on show at the National Trust property Oxburgh Hall in Norfolk.
