A French [Ormolu](#) & Porcelain Table de Dame

The top set with a rare yellow-ground porcelain hand-decorated panel with floral scenes and birds within parcel gilt frames and a mahogany reserve around the galleried edge, with conforming porcelain set within the sides and drawer-front, the rectangular table supported on tapering legs joined by a curved stretcher surmounted by a finial, the corners held with putti caryatids with flowering baskets on their heads and Ionic capitals. Some of the porcelain signed 'JG.'

The pattern repeated on the porcelain is the so-called 'œil de perdrix,' meaning 'partridge eye' first popularised by Sèvres in the late 18th century. Some of the best [Sèvres porcelain](#) featured this background pattern, in combination with panels depicting birds, such as the part service sold at Christie's in 2019 for \$399,000 USD.
